- Define construct validity frameworks for an AI system designed to train therapists and nurses in clinical communication, identifying behavioral markers of active listening, empathic response, and appropriate pacing for computational modeling
- Advise on assessment and feedback design for a learn → practice → AI feedback training cycle, ensuring evaluations capture meaningful skill acquisition and that generated reports are credible, actionable, and motivating
- Examine ethical implications of AI-generated communication, with attention to psychological safety, cultural considerations, and accessibility for underrepresented populations

- Conduct coding and analysis of qualitative data to identify patterns in participants' support-seeking preferences and attitudes toward AI-mediated communication
- Collect survey data in school settings, including administering measures and conducting child assent procedures in accordance with IRB protocols

- Designed and piloted a new survey assessing adaptive and maladaptive risk behaviors in emerging adults, examining links with impulsivity, sensation-seeking, and personality traits; presented preliminary findings at the Society for the Study of Emerging Adulthood (SSEA) Conference
- Conducted an experimental study (N = 60) testing whether reflecting on positive experiences improves body image and self-perceptions; preliminary analyses showed large effects ($d = .90$) of positive reflection on photo self-descriptions, with results presented at SSEA
- Apply quantitative and qualitative methods (survey development, coding of linguistic data, statistical analyses) to investigate protective factors for youth and emerging adult well-being

- Draft a full scholarly manuscript linking disclosure-based communication skills to potential clinical applications for anxiety reduction
